1 Minutes of previous meeting and matters arising

a. The minutes of the previous Business Meeting held on 30th July 2022 were reviewed. **Voted, accepted.**

- b. Use of zoom: Please refer to previous minutes for details.
- c. Toilets refurbishment update: This project will now be handed to the newly formed Church Building Committee.
- d. Heating system update: heating system has now been fully flushed and is operating effectively.

2 Treasurer's Report

- a. The Business meeting viewed Oxford Church bank statement to 31-12-2022.
- b. The church finance report and the departmental working budgets and balances were reviewed by the treasurer.
- c. Correction; the sum taken by Stanborough Press should show £525.72 annually (£43.81 monthly) rather than £350.48. The treasurer stated that further clarification is required regarding the purpose of the £525.72 annual payment as originally the charge was to help support Stanborough Press during lockdown, but now it seems to cover the quarterly provision of The Messenger publication.
- d. Subject to the correction of £525.72 being inserted in place of £350.48, the report was **Voted**, **accepted**.

3. Oxford Church Budget for 2023

- a. The business meeting viewed the church budget forecast for 2023.
- b. The meeting was informed that the budget contains provisional figures, set by the finance committee, based on the projected total church income for 2023. Where departmental plans require additional funds, these proposals can be reviewed at the next business meeting which should take place mid-way through the year.
- c. It was pointed out that Banbury Group budget is not included in the Oxford church budget because this is managed as a separate entity and will appear as a separate budget.
- d. Banbury Group requested a projected budget outline for 2023 from oxford treasury.
- e. Oxford Church budget was then Voted, accepted.

4. Banbury Church Group report and plans

- a. The group started with approximately 15 regular attendees including children and has now grown to approximately 30 regular attendees. At their last communion service there were 42 adults and children in attendance.
- b. The weekly objective; "To work with, and include the local community in our activities".
- c. General Moto; "Each One to Reach One".
- d. The group meet in a local childcare centre twice a month where they have an opportunity to connect with the locals.
- e. Visitation of a local Elderly Care Home has occurred a few times where the group will sing and witness to the residents.
- f. The group plan to bring a youth program to the elderly care home.

- g. There is a plan to distribute books in the surrounding area of the meeting hall.
- h. Long-term plan; to purchase a meeting hall. A disused hall has now been identified.
- i. Banbury Group is now financially self-sufficient. Ultimately the aim of every church plant is to be self-sufficient. Oxford Church Board agreed that Banbury Group may approach Oxford Church for further financial assistance as the need arises.
